Yellow Pear

An heirloom, they grow on tall, rangy plants and bear in heavy clusters of 1 ¾ inch sized fruits. Children especially love their unique shape. Mild flavored and sweet. Indeterminate, mid



Sungold - Personal Favorite

Customer Favorite! Delicious, juicy, sweet; Sungold glows with golden orange color. Foliage is a pretty bluish green color. A treat to eat straight from the vine, warmed by the sun. Indeterminate, mid



Chocolate Cherry

Loaded with clusters of sweet little gems. The 1" cherry-like fruits are a rich brick red. Perfect for salads with an exceptional flavor that is rich and complex. Indeterminate, mid



Bumble Bee

A spectacular mix of pink with yellow stripes, yellow with red stripes and purple striped with metallic green. Round, 1", crack-resistant fruits. Indeterminate, mid



Juliet

Sweet flavored fruits shaped like grapes. Glossy red and crack resistant, they stay on the vine longer than other cherry tomatoes. Indeterminate, mid



Tumbler

Specially bred for hanging baskets. Bushy plants look fantastic mixed with lobelia and alyssum. Sweet, bright red fruits. Determinate, mid



Brad's Atomic Grape

The color is unusual - lavender and purple stripes, turning to olive-green, red, and brown/blue stripes when fully ripe. Fruit holds well on the vine. Olive green interior is blushed with red when dead-ripe. Crack-resistant and sweet! Wispy foliage. Indeterminate, mid-season



Grapette

Thin-skinned and juicy, with a distinctive shape. Oblong fruits are produced in clusters of 16 to 40 fruits. Ideal for America's current preference for smaller, grape shaped tomatoes. Semi-determinate, mid



Super Sweet 100

These plants need staking or caging but will reward you by producing long strands of super sweet red tomatoes. Great in salads or right off the vine. Indeterminate, mid



Sugary - PF

The sweet flavor and pink skins are absolutely wonderful. Oval-shaped, slightly pointed fruits are productive and will always have place in my garden. Semi-determinate, mid



Green Grape - PF

A ripe green cherry tomato. They burst into sweet juicy goodness when you bite into them. They turn a lovely golden green when ripe. Plant in a large container on your deck. Determinate, mid



Isis Candy - PF

They are a marbled reddish color with a starburst on the underside. Sweet and fruity. Heavy yields of short trusses, in double rows, of 6 to 8 fruits each. Indeterminate. mid

2019 Tomatoes

**Jelly Bean**

Small, oblong Shaped. sweet, red cherry tomatoes grow in clusters of 15-30 fruits like grapes. They resist cracking and hold well on the vine for days. Indeterminate, mid

**Sun Sugar**

Golden-yellow fruits are a lovely contrast of tangy and sweet. A good substitute for Sungold, with Sungold being a bit sweeter. Indeterminate, mid

**Honeybunch**

Super-yielding, vigorous vines produce long trusses of 1/4- 1/2" currant-type fruits early and throughout the summer. Slightly smaller than other cherry varieties, Honeybunch is big on flavor, sweet and juicy. Indeterminate, early

**Italian Ice**

Sweet and bursting with juicy flavor. Clusters of 1" to 1 1/2" fruits ripen from green to ivory white. Very prolific and delicious. Indeterminate, mid

**Moby Grape**

A customer of mine requested this last year and I was able to find the seed after much searching. Distinctively sweet 2 inch red grape tomatoes are delicious eaten by the handful right off the vine or added to salads. Suitable for large containers. Determinate, mid

**Sun Cherry**

Bite sized, super sweet and thin skinned. What more could you ask of a cherry tomato? Vigorous plants produce a wealth of bright red fruits. Indeterminate, mid

**Chocolate Sprinkles**

This new one is the first dark tomato with a strong package of disease resistance. Dramatically colored, with faint green stripes against a dark, brick red background. Grape-shaped fruits, 1 in. by 1 1/2-in., are richly sweet and grow in trusses of 6 to 8. Hybrid vigor gives it unequalled yields. Indeterminate, mid

**Riesentraube - PF**

The name of this German heirloom variety means 'giant bunch of grapes'; Bouquet-type blossoms turn into bunches of 20 to 40 small, oval red fruit with pointed ends. Vines are covered with fruit. Flavor is excellent. Indeterminate. mid

**Super Snow White - PF**

Very sweet, ivory-colored cherry tomatoes. They reach the size of ping pong balls. These plants produce tons of tomatoes. Indeterminate. mid

**Mini Orange**

Vines produce an abundance of miniature bright, orange tomatoes. Flavor is mild and slightly tangy. Ripens from green to yellow to orange. Indeterminate, mid

**Sweet Chelsea**

Tremendous 5 to 6 ft. vines yield loads of early, super-sweet, tender-skinned fruits. Vines boast as many as 10 clusters of fruit at one time, each with 15 to 20 large cherries, 1 to 1-1/2" in diameter. Displays high crack-resistance and drought tolerance. Low in acid. Performs best when staked. Nice for fresh market, bears full-season. Indeterminate, mid

**Blush - PF**

These 2 inch long cherry tomatoes have a surprising sweet/tart flavor and are ready to pick when the pink blush appears over the yellow background. Indeterminate, mid

**Candyland Red - PF**

Candyland Red is the only AAS award winning currant-type tomato. Currant tomatoes are smaller in size than cherry-type and are ready to "pop" in your mouth straight from the garden. Gardeners will appreciate the dark red, sweet flavored fruit that can be enjoyed throughout the season. Indeterminate. mid

**Sweet Million**

Terrific flavor in high yields of super-sweet cherry tomatoes. Long chains of smooth, dark red, 1 to 1 1/2 fruits are produced on large plants. Matures early. Indeterminate, mid

**Matt's Wild Cherry**

Small cherry tomatoes packed with intense, rich tomato flavor, balanced with sweetness. Tall plants. Originally from Mexico, where these tomatoes grow wild. Indeterminate, mid

**Sweet Treats - PF**

Prolific wonderful pink cherry tomatoes that are fairly early and are sweet and juicy. Uniform and crack-free, ping pong sized fruits. Indeterminate, mid

**Blue Cream Berries**

A super-sweet cherry tomato, cream berries are super prolific. These boast a delicate but complex flavor and a beautiful cream color with purple-blue splashes on the shoulder. A Wild Boar variety. Indeterminate, mid



Green Doctor's Frosted Grape

A sweet, spicy and delicious cherry. Green with silvery shoulders. Small, slightly pear shaped fruit. Fruit is yellowish-lime green with kiwi-green colored flesh. Large vines produce huge yields of these little cherries. Some plants produce bright green fruit; others produce "frosted" fruit, which are lighter in color and even sweeter. Indeterminate, mid.



Sweetie

Sweet-tasting. Grows exceptionally well in the home garden. Ideal for eating fresh, salads, relishes and canning. Prolific producer. Indeterminate. mid



Black Cherry - PF

Love the flavor, love how sweet it is, love the color, love how healthy the plant is! You will adore this blackish-purple skinned, cherry tomato with dark red flesh and a sweet and juicy flavor. Indeterminate, mid



Lucky Tiger

Customer Request Elongated green striped cherry tomato with a striking red blush. As Lucky Tiger ripens, the green striping becomes more defined and the background turns red as the interior marbling develops. Excellent sweet, tart flavor. Part of the Artisan series tomatoes. Indeterminate, mid



Brown Berry

Heirloom tomato produce vigorous regular-leaf tomato plants that yield really large crops of mahogany (brick-red) , 1" round, cherry tomatoes. The Brown Berry cherry tomato has excellent semi-sweet, fruity, with just a slight bit of an acid finish. Very Juicy! Indeterminate, mid



Winter Grape - Grappoli d'Inverno

Also known as Pomodoro Galatina from the town in Southern Puglia where it is from. Grape-shaped red cherry, producing loads of great tasting sweet fruit. Tomatoes hold well on the vine and after they're picked. The variety does well in a pot or container and is a good candidate for hanging and drying on the plant. Determinate, mid



Moby Grape

A customer of mine requested this last year and I was able to find the seed after much searching. Distinctively sweet 2 inch red grape tomatoes are delicious eaten by the handful right off the vine or added to salads. Suitable for large containers. Determinate, mid



Rose Quartz

A very productive heirloom cherry plant from Japan producing large pink cherries in clusters. Absolutely delicious flavor. Multifloras (*aka compound inflorescence*) are tomato varieties that produce legions of fruit, Indeterminate, mid.



Yummy - PF

This is a grape shaped tomato grown by mistake. There was an error in seeds we got from a supplier and this is what came up. Fortunately, it was sweet and delicious and very prolific too. We were able to save seed from this. Indeterminate, mid



Jolly

A lovely pink fruited cherry that has good acid content and exceptionally sweet flavor in meaty fruits that are produced in clusters of 9 to 14, weighing 1-1/2 oz. each, with a distinct peach shape and an unusual pointy tip. Indeterminate, mid



Sweet Baby Girl - PF

These are delicious, super-sweet cherry tomatoes and set incredible yields of luscious red fruits in long clusters. Crack-resistant fruits weigh less than 1 oz. and keep well after harvesting. Good disease resistance. Indeterminate, mid

Early



Independence Day

Be the first one in your neighborhood to have ripe tomatoes this year! If planted in early May, you can have ripe tomatoes by the Fourth of July. Round, 2 to 3 inch pink fruit have a great tomato flavor which is not always typical with other early varieties. Perfect for salads and for slicing. It would be interesting to see if this beats out the fourth of July tomato. Indeterminate, early



Better Bush

Perfect for large containers or small gardens. That is because the compact plants are attractive while yielding good-sized 8 oz. fruit with real tomato flavor. Stocky plants grow 3 to 4 ft. tall with an upright habit, making staking needs minimal. Determinate, mid



Bush Blue Ribbon

Compact habit and fruits averaging 8 to 10 oz. Featuring an exceptional sweet flavor, with lots of juice. Strong disease resistance. Perfect for containers. Determinate, early



Bush Beefsteak

Compact plant is just loaded with large, flavorful tomatoes. Well-suited for a patio, small garden and containers, the dwarf plants offer big meaty fruit (8-12 oz.) and early maturity. Determinate, early



Early Goliath

Luscious flavor and broad disease resistance add up to an early tomato that will give Early Girl a run for her money. Extra large harvests of red sweet fruits. Indeterminate, early



Siletz

Large and early, producing deep red, round fruits. Produces even during cooler weather. Another outstanding OSU intro by Dr. Jim Baggett. Determinate, early



Subarctic Plenty - PF

A really sweet tomato. Allegedly developed in the 1940's by the U.S. Military to provide fresh tomatoes to their troops in Greenland. Sets lots of 2" red fruits with sweet, "real tomato" flavor. Determinate, early



Early Girl

Bears heavy crops extremely early. Large clusters of 5 oz. fruits. Bright red and meaty with a lot of flavor and aroma. Indeterminate, early



Oregon Spring

Consistently 10 days earlier than Early Girl, Oregon Spring is compact, bearing fine flavored, nearly seedless, tomatoes. Great for cooler climates & container planting. Determinate, early



Stupice - PF

A native of Czechoslovakia, where it's extreme earliness, tolerance to cold, and high yields have earned it worldwide attention. Fruits are sweet, and 1 to 2 oz. Indeterminate, early



Polar Beauty

Developed in Alaska for colder climates, it bears small to medium-sized tomatoes with a good, full tomato taste. Short, bushy plants are productive. Determinate, early



Fireworks

One of the largest, earliest red slicing tomatoes with excellent flavor. Its bright red fruit are produced heavily on vigorous plants. Indeterminate, early



Ultimate Opener - PF

This new tomato developed by the same breeder of Early Girl and Better Boy Hybrids. Strong, vigorous plants are capable of tremendous yields. Indeterminate, early



Siberian

This might be the earliest tomato ever. Capable of setting fruits at 38F. The fruits are bright red, 3 to 5 oz. and bunch in clusters. Good for a patio. Determinate, early



Jetsetter - PF

Short season gardeners will love this variety that doesn't sacrifice size or flavor for early maturity. Tomatoes are at least 8 ozs. and often larger with good, rich flavor. Prolific yields. Indeterminate, early



Glacier

Extremely early, cold-tolerant, strain of tomato plant. Begins flowering when only 4" high. Fruits have outstanding flavor for an early tomato. Semi-determinate, early



Early Wonder - PF

Extra-early maturing and compact variety that yields an abundant crop of round, dark-pink, great-tasting fruit. Perfect for gardeners in shorter season growing climates. Determinate, early



Fourth of July

The first tomato to ripen by Independence Day (hopefully)! Enjoy the plentiful harvest about 49 days after setting plants in the garden. Determinate, early



Siberia

This may be the earliest tomato- only 7 weeks from transplanting to table. Capable of setting fruits at 38 F on sturdy, dark green plants. Fruits are bright red, 3 to 5 oz. and grow in clusters. Good for patios. Determinate, early



Bush Early Girl

All the desirable qualities of Early Girl in a compact, patio-type variety: extreme earliness, firm, meaty, flavorful fruits, blemish-resistant skin with yields all summer long. Fruits are a full 4" in diameter, bright red and slightly flattened. Good for large containers. Determinate, early



Bush Goliath

Specially developed for patio gardeners. Compact plants grow up to 3-1/2 ft. tall, have large, red, 3-4" fruits with great taste and high sugar content. Bears consistently up to frost and needs little staking. Determinate, early



Manitoba

An extremely early variety developed by the Morden Experiment Farm in Manitoba for southern Canadian prairies. Particularly well suited for extreme northern areas. Fruits are bright red, slightly flattened, good-flavored, and weigh about 6 oz. each. Easily grown in a small area. Determinate, early



Maskotka

A bushy, dwarf variety, especially bred for growing in baskets, where stems and fruits cascade over the sides. Plants produce a heavy crop of sweet, red fruits with good resistance to cracking. Determinate, early



Moskvich

One of the largest early tomatoes. Fruits are early, deep red, and cold tolerant. Rich flavor. Smooth and globe-shaped. 4-6 oz. with a small stem scar. Like all Russians it can stand up to cool conditions. Indeterminate, early



Champion II

The perfect slicer for sandwiches. An improvement on the popular Champion, with much better disease resistance, while maintaining its distinctive sweet taste, earliness and large, 6 to 8-oz. fruits that are smooth and meaty. Indeterminate, early



Fantastic

Tasty, globe-shaped, scarlet red, 3 to 5", medium-sized fruits are almost crack-free. Meaty and rich in beefsteak flavor. Heavy yields and excellent for canning. Indeterminate, early



Jet Star

Jet Star tomato plants produce big yields of large, red fruit, free of cracks and scars. Globe-shaped fruit with bright, attractive color has good taste and lower acid than most other reds. Sturdy, compact tomato vines grow vigorously, producing heavily. Try this in a container.. Determinate, early

Paste



Jersey Devil

This variety was made popular many years ago by a seed company that is no longer in business. Many gardeners still remember fondly this prolific variety with 4 to 6 inch long, tapered red fruits shaped like banana peppers. The tomatoes are very meaty and sweet with few seeds -- great for sauces, salsas, or even eating fresh. Color is a gorgeous bright red and yield is impressive.



Roman Candle - PF

Beautiful, neon yellow banana-shaped fruits are bursting with sweetness and flavor. A tomato that originated as a 'sport' from Mr. John Swenson's Speckled Roman. This is a lovely tomato. Indeterminate. mid



Oregon Star

An early maturing, red, paste-type tomato, 'Oregon Star' fruits are firm making them easy to pick and to peel. The fruits are large, irregularly shaped, and tend to be seedless (parthenocarpic). The later wave of fruits that mature towards the end of the season are smaller, contain viable seeds, and are where the seed harvest comes from. Determinate, mid!



Orange Banana

Unique, orange, paste tomatoes, bursting with fruity sweetness. Perfect for drying, canning, and paste and fresh eating. Orange color is rare in paste tomatoes. Determinate, mid



Rocky

Good producer of 2 x 3 inch, 1 lb., plum-shaped, red, paste tomatoes. Sweet, tangy, meaty fruit. These tomatoes can get very large, not unlike the Polish Linguisa. One of the best flavored sauce tomatoes and great for canning. Intermediate, mid-season



Roma

The number one choice for home canning and sauces for years. Fruits are medium sized and hang in large clusters. Perfect for canning. Determinate, mid



Amish Paste - PF

This one dates back to the turn of the century and is the best for sauces and canning. It bears large 8 oz. deep red fruits with "real" tomato flavor. Indeterminate, mid



Opalka

More flavorful than most paste tomatoes. It can be eaten straight off the vine, but is prized for sauces and canning. Foliage is wispy but it produces heavy crops. Heirloom from Poland. Indeterminate. mid



Polish Linguisa - PF

Loaded with vitamins, fiber and potassium, but low in fat and sodium! (Unlike it's meat counterpart) This 19th Century heirloom sets more fruit than most heirlooms. Fruits are large. Indeterminate, mid



Cream Sausage - PF

This is a paste tomato that is creamy white to pale yellow. It lights up the garden. One of the first to ripen in my garden. With mild, sweet flavor, these bushy, compact plants are perfect in a large pot. Try making salsa with this one to impress your friends with it's beautiful sunny color. Determinate, mid



San Marzano Redorta

San Marzano Redorta. Named for a mountain in the Alps, this is a very large (10-12 ounce) San Marzano type plum tomato. Large, vigorous plant. This has real tomato flavor and is good to eat fresh, make sauce, can or dry. I have a customer who couldn't say enough good things about this one. Indeterminate, mid



San Marzano

Slightly later than Romas, they have excellent flavor and hang in large clusters. Holds well on the vine and has extra-high solids for canning. The fruits are slightly rectangular in shape. Indeterminate, mid



SuperMarzano

Supermarzano tomato is a hybrid paste tomato, similar to the traditional San Marzano tomato but with improved disease resistance. If you have had problems growing San Marzano in the past, give this one a try. Tall, vining, vigorous plants need trellising. Fruits are about 5 inches long and weigh 5 oz. In Italy, they are preferred as a salad tomato when they are pink shading to red at the neck. Productive over a long season. Indeterminate, mid



Speckled Roman - PF

SSE member John Swenson, developed this cross of Antique Roman and Banana Legs. Orange-red, 5" long fruits are speckled and marked by irregular yellow stripes. Meaty fruits have hearty, "real tomato" flavor and almost no seeds. Indeterminate., mid



Sausage

Here's an unusually shaped tomato with fruits up to 6" long, like huge, red banana peppers. A prolific paste tomato, with fine flavored meat that is especially ideal for ketchup or sauces. Indeterminate, mid



San Marzano

Slightly later than Romas, they have excellent flavor and hang in large clusters. Holds well on the vine and has extra-high solids for canning. The fruits are slightly rectangular in shape. Indeterminate, mid

Heirloom



Aunt Ruby's German Green

Don't let the color fool you, this one is good. Too me, it has a sweet almost winy flavor. Globe-shaped fruits are smooth skinned, green blushed with pink. Indeterminate, mid



Georgia Streak

This is a beautiful beefsteak tomato that is predominantly golden yellow with a red blush. Streaks of red run throughout the flesh. Tomatoes range from 1 to 2 lbs. and have an excellent sweet, fruity taste. From Georgia. Indeterminate. mid



Polish Pastel

Small-leafed plant from John Smarz of Australia producing unusual 10-14 oz., bi-colored fruit with beautiful red & yellow striping and/or mottling. Fruit is very meaty (not juicy) producing only few seeds. Very sweet flavors. Indeterminate, mid



Nebraska Wedding - PF

An old Great Plains heirloom Produces globe-shaped fruits of a deep orange color, weighing up to 10 oz. each. Plant yields are heavy. In the old days, seeds were given to a married couple to help them start their new lives together, hence the name. Intermediate, mid



Bonny Best

The famous old canning tomato introduced in 1908 by Bonnie Plant Farm in Union Spring, Alabama. Medium-sized fruit are red and loaded with flavor. Becoming hard to find. Indeterminate, mid



Black Prince

Named for the Gypsies who live in Russia, this is one of the deepest, maroon tomatoes. It has great color and good taste. Medium-sized fruit. A lovely introduction from Soviet plant breeders. Indeterminate, mid



Taxi

The best tomato variety for an early, lemon-yellow tomato. Popular heirloom. Compact, bushy, regular-leaf tomato plants that yield 4-6 oz., round, delicious, bright-yellow tomatoes that are very sweet. Determinate, mid



Coustralee

An heirloom variety from France, producing large red beefsteaks with ribbed shoulders. Fruit is about 4" across, quite meaty, and smoothly textured. Large crops of, beautiful tomatoes. Indeterminate, mid

**Green Giant**

Potato leaf. Large emerald-green fruit is over one pound in weight, uniform, very smooth and blemish-free. Color stays pure green even when dead ripe! Maybe a little yellowish tinge on the bottom. Plants are very robust and require staking. Very few seeds; outstanding, complex flavor—very sweet and juicy. Indeterminate, mid

**Aussie - PF**

An heirloom tomato variety from Australia. Regular-leaf tomato plants that dependably yield large amounts of delicious, 1-2 lb., glossy-red, meaty, fluted, beefsteak tomatoes. Indeterminate, mid

**Costoluto Fiorentino**

Old Tuscan Heirloom variety with dark red skin. Slightly flattened with fluted shoulders. Fruits are typically about 8 ounces. High in sugar with excellent acid, good fresh or made into sauces. Indeterminate, mid

**Hazel Mae**

From Jerry Moomaw's grandmother, the same source as Hazel Gold, who first offered this variety in the Seed Savers 1997 Yearbook. Good yield of large, 1-2 lb., yellow tomatoes with some red striping and/or marbling. Sweet tropical fruit flavors & juicy beefsteak. slightly ribbed, thin skin, juicy Indeterminate, mid

**African Queen**

Very much like potato-leaf Brandywine, but 3 inch, fruit is darker pink to purple. Meaty with good flavors, Indeterminate, mid

**Old Flame**

Flame is an old heirloom tomato from West Virginia, dating back to the 1880s. These bicolor tomatoes look as if they are on fire. Sweet with lots of old time tomato flavor. Indeterminate, mid

**Gold Medal - PF**

A Ben Quisenberry tomato. Wonderful, 1-1/2 lb., yellow and red bicolor beefsteak tomato with pink marbling in blossom end, thin skin and luscious sweet, well-balanced flavors. Indeterminate, mid

**Marmande**

French heirloom. Historically a popular variety grown for market. Producing clusters of 6-10 ounce deep red, slightly flattened, oblate fruits that are meaty, lightly lobed with an excellent slightly tart taste. This variety also does well in cooler summer conditions. A great tomato for slicing and sandwiches. Indeterminate, mid

**Marglobe - PF**

Developed in 1917, introduced by the USDA in 1925. Good producer of 7-10 oz deep red, juicy, sweet tasting fruits. These tomatoes can claim parentage of many of today's hybrid tomatoes. Indeterminate, mid

**Mellow Yellow**

The fruits are enormous and a beautiful yellow with a red blush. Very juicy and sweet, one slice was enough for a sandwich. Despite their size, it was a bit earlier than my other heirlooms and a great producer. Indeterminate, mid

**Rose - PF**

I won the largest tomato of the 2011 Spokane County Fair with this one. A large leafy heirloom that produces deep, rose-pink, 3", meaty globes with great taste. Indeterminate, mid

**Big Rainbow - PF**

I love this spectacular heirloom tomato. Originally from Polk County, MN. Big, regular-leaf tomato plants yield crops of 1-2 lb. sweet, bicolored beefsteak tomatoes with gold flesh and red streaks. Indeterminate, mid

**My Love's Pink Oxheart - PF**

HUGE pink tomatoes that are oxheart shaped, meaty, and have fantastic flavor. They have a good balance of sweet and acid. Indeterminate, mid

**Orange Beefsteak**

Regular leaf plant produces large amounts of 3-4", round, orange (golden), beefsteak tomatoes loaded with delicious, well-balanced, sweet, fruity flavors. A good sandwich tomato or salad tomato or eating fresh off the vine. Indeterminate, mid

**German Red Strawberry PF**

Big, meaty and fine flavored. This German heirloom has uniform fruits averaging 10 oz. Solid meat has few seeds and little juice, yet delivers big on taste. Indeterminate, mid

**Mortgage Lifter - PF**

These long time favorites are also known as Radiator Charlie. They produce good yields of large, smooth, pink-skinned fruits and have few seeds, even in times of drought. Mild, sweet flavor. We love these! We've had 1-2 Lb. tomatoes. Indeterminate, mid to late season



Brandywine Pink

Fruit that is superior in taste and smoothness. Its tomatoes are indeed special, 1 to 2 pound pink beefsteaks with the delectably complex, rich, sweet flavor that has made Brandywine justifiably famous. Indeterminate, late



Brandywine, Red - PF

It produces medium-sized, 8 to 12 oz. round, smooth red fruit that are juicy and loaded with intense tomato flavor. Expect high yields of this very flavorful tomato. Indeterminate. mid



Kellogg's Breakfast - PF

One of our favorites. Lovely, pale-orange fruits are solid and meaty throughout, packed with mild and delicious. Large, beefsteak-type fruits, up to 16 oz., Indeterminate, mid



Amana Orange - PF

Deep golden orange fruits are mild, sweet, delicious and the flesh very smooth to the tongue. This heirloom takes its name from Amana, Iowa. Indeterminate, mid



German Johnson Pink

An old-time favorite heirloom from the East features tall plants and a fairly early harvest of large, slightly ribbed pink-red tomatoes averaging 1 lb. Meaty with few seeds and really excellent flavor. Indeterminate, mid.



Box Car Willie

An Heirloom producing a nice crop of good-sized, smooth red tomatoes with delicious flavor. Indeterminate. mid



Caspian Pink

Originally grown in southern Russia between the Caspian and Black Seas. These prolific, 1-2 pound, globe-shaped, pleated, pink-red beefsteak tomatoes that rival Brandywine in popularity and flavor. Perfect for cooler climates. Indeterminate, mid



Pineapple - PF

I didn't get a lot but its worth the real estate. The first one I ever picked was a "two hander" size! When I sliced it in half, I knew I was in love. The interior was a beautiful collage of orange, gold and red. Juicy and fruity sweet. Indeterminate, late



Coure de Bue

This Italian heirloom has been a favorite in Italy for many years. Fluted, beautiful fruit has a delicious sweet taste; similar to the shape of a heart; great for fresh eating or saucing. Large vigorous vines. Indeterminate, mid



Rose De Berne

This Swiss émigré could be considered the Brandywine of continental Europe. Beautiful, nicely-shaped 4-to 8-oz fruit are a rose-pink color and have an excellent sweet flavor. The vines set good yields. Intermediate, mid to late.



Ananas Noir - PF

Ananas Noir is French for black pineapple; it arose out of a planting of Pineapple in a Belgian garden. The exterior is dark purple and green with pink-red splotches and a touch of yellow, inside is bright green streaked with pink. Sweet and delicious. Indeterminate. mid



Black from Tula - PF

A large 8-12 oz. dark tomato with a rich, deep purplish-brown color. Some seed savers say it is the best tasting of all the dark tomatoes. Very rich, old-fashioned flavor, sweet and spicy. A rare Russian heirloom. mid



Anna Russian

An heirloom oxheart variety from a Russian immigrant. Early maturing for a heart-shaped tomato, the large, pink-red fruit normally weighs about 1 pound. Superb old-fashioned flavors with lots of juice. Indeterminate. mid



Park's Whopper

This tomato has great disease resistance, high yields, and a long growing season. Big, juicy, meaty sandwich-sized tomatoes appear early on indeterminate vines that continue until frost. These vines are vigorous, so be sure to stake or cage well. Indeterminate Mid to late



Vintage Wine - PF

One of the very few pastel-hued tomatoes. A favorite of my customers, with attractive, 1lb., pale pink/red fruits set off by golden stripes. Elegant, sweet and tasty, with a nice, mild flavor. Indeterminate, mid



Carbon - PF

Large, sweet and pretty. Big, regular-leaf tomato plants yield 10-14 oz., beautiful purple-black tomatoes. Delicious, rich, complex flavors. This tomato variety won a taste test of 10 heirloom tomato varieties at Cornell Research Farm. Indeterminate, mid

**Paul Robeson**

Russian heirloom named after the operatic artist who won acclaim as an advocate of equal rights for Blacks. A dusky, dark-red, with dark-green shoulders, and red flesh. Fine flavor with a good acid/sweet balance. From Siberia, it's good for cooler growing regions. Indeterminate, mid

**Cherokee Purple**

Reliable producer of medium pink-purple fruits that average 8 to 12 oz. Fruits are round to oblate, with no cracking. Exhibits tolerance to mild drought as well as to common diseases. Indeterminate, mid

**Red Pear (Large Italian)**

A pear-type tomato, this one is large and somewhat ribbed with thin skin and a delicious, slightly sweet flavor. It bears a large number of fruit, which are good enough to eat fresh, but also perfect for cooking. Indeterminate, mid to late

**Moonglow**

Perfect-looking golden-orange tomato: smooth and medium-sized. Fine flavored, rich and fruity. These are good producers of consistent looking fruit. Indeterminate, mid.

**Tigerella**

Huge crops of red fruits with clearly defined yellow-orange stripes. 1-1/2 to 2" tomatoes have a rich, tangy flavor and are a beautiful novelty for adding whole or cutting into salads. Indeterminate, mid

**White Beauty**

Parchment-white tomatoes are extra smooth and beautiful. Renowned for their sweet, citrus taste that is richer and more complex than many white types. This variety is perfect for making an interesting and delicious white tomato sauce or for eating fresh out of hand. In 1927 Isbell's Seed Co., of Jackson, Michigan, said that this was the best white variety that they had ever grown. Some sources say it may have been introduced as early as 1850. This 8 oz. variety is a wonderful piece of American history that is just too great to be lost. Indeterminate, mid

**Old German**

A favorite in the Virginia Mennonite community. Yellow fruits have a red center, visible on the surface and throughout the core. They often weigh over a pound, with few seeds. Indeterminate, mid to late

**Giant Tree Tomato - PF**

10 to 18 ft. vines have strong stems and heavy thick leaves. Globe-shaped, pinkish-red fruits, with few seeds, are smooth and weigh 1 - 2 lbs. Indeterminate, mid to late

**Burpee's Globe**

Burpee's 'Globe' is similar to, and likely a selection of, 'Livingston's Globe'. The plants are heavy yielding, vigorous vines, with globular, smooth and very solid, pink fruits; good quality. Introduced in 1936 by the W. Atlee Burpee Seed Company and was an "All-America Selection®" winner that same year.. Indeterminate, mid

**Black Krim**

Deep, dark red with green shoulders. The interior is a reddish green color. They are an heirloom for the Crimean peninsula of Russia. Producing 10-12 oz. fruits, they set well in heat. The flavor is rich, earthy, almost smoky. Indeterminate, mid

**Arkansas Traveler**

A medium-sized pink tomato that ripens to a beautiful rose color. From Ozarks in Arkansas, tolerant to heat and humidity; crack and disease resistant. Good flavor. Indeterminate, mid

**Abraham Lincoln**

This old-time variety produces many 6 to 10 oz tomatoes, packed with great tomato flavor. Popular since the early 1920's, it's no wonder considering its productivity and flavor. Indeterminate. mid

**Orange Russian - PF**

Arguably, the most beautiful tomato I've ever seen! Tomatoes are usually heart-shaped with golden flesh marbled with streaks of red. I have grown some that were almost 3 pounds. Fruity and dense with few seeds. Indeterminate, mid to late

**Black Sea Man**

A Russian Heirloom tomato. Plants yield tomatoes with a rich mahogany and olive green shoulders. Inside is deep, reddish green and loaded with flavor. This tomato does well growing in containers. Determinate, mid

**Great White - PF**

Sweet and fruity, perfect for salads and sandwiches. An almost perfect, "white" tomato with low acidity and few seeds. When ripe, the fruit will have a very smooth creamy white texture. Indeterminate, mid

**Big Ben aka Stump of the World**

Introduced by the late Ben Quisenberry, this is an potato leaf plant producing a lot of large, 1 lb., dark pink, meaty tomatoes. Small seed cavity. It is a bit smaller and more productive than Brandywine, offers outstandingly rich flavor. The name: One theory is that this variety was named by Ben after a bible reference, as Ben was a very religious man. The speculation is that the 'Stump' being referred to is the stump or root of Jesse in the bible.. Indeterminate, mid

**Brandywine Yellow**

This modern strain of classic Brandywine delivers world famous flavor packed into fruits that weigh up to one pound. They are firm, juicy and have an incredible, rich tomato taste. Potato-leaved plants do well under a wide range of conditions. Fruits mature later in northern areas. Indeterminate, mid

**Big Boy**

The Big Boy hybrid tomato debuted in 1949, What's kept Big Boy tomato a best-selling tomato all these years is the wonderful aroma and rich flavor. The fruits are large, up to 1 pound or more. Indeterminate, mid

**Kosovo - PF**

This variety came from a former U.N. worker in Kosovo. Huge, deep pink heart-shaped fruit has a sweet rich flavor and is very meaty. Production was excellent. Tomatoes can grow up to 1 pound. Indeterminate, mid

**Pretty in Pink**

Pink tomatoes are the latest rage, so we went to Asia where pinks out-sell reds to get this new gem. Loads of sweet, mild, 6 to 8 oz., disease resistant fruits with Slightly fluted shoulders. Indeterminate, mid

**Celebrity**

This AAS Award Winner established a new standard for main-crop hybrids requiring multiple disease resistance. Medium sized, globe-shaped fruits are crack-resistant and average 7 oz. .Semi-determinate, mid

**Delicious - PF**

Excellent slicer, most fruits weigh 1 lb. and still holds the world record of 7+ pounds for a single fruit! Produces smooth and solid fruits that seldom crack, with small cavities, nearly solid meat, and excellent flavor. Indeterminate, mid

**Homestead**

This densely foliated plant produces very firm, dark red, flattened globe shaped fruit, each weighing 7 to 8 ozs. Does well in hot or humid weather. A great choice for canning! Determinate vines, mid

**Mister E - PF**

This is a seed we saved from Big Zac. Our seed reverted back to one of it's parent which was a larger, open pollinated pink tomato. It is very sweet and lovely. These are large. Indeterminate, mid

**Better Boy**

A spectacular, midseason variety with plump, juicy, deep red tomatoes that often weigh more than one pound. Very flavorful, with flesh that's juicy, yet firm. Indeterminate, mid

**Mountain Fresh Plus Hyb**

One of the most sought after Mountains, as it features better flavor and larger, 8 to 16 ounce fruits than either Mountain Pride or Mountain Spring. Very firm and flavorful. Determinate, mid-late

Main Season

**Goliath**

Beautiful, smooth, bright-red fruits average 10 to 15 oz., with a sweet luscious flavor. Tall, plants will produce lots of these perfectly shaped tomatoes. Multiple disease resistance. Indeterminate, mid

**Legend - PF**

Legend has shown a strong tolerance to blight. Round, shiny red fruits, with sweet flavor and just a little acid to add a touch of zing. Nice tomatoes with skin that feels kind of velvety. Determinate, mid



Momotaro

Momotaro Tomato (F1) is the most popular fresh tomato in Japan. In the US it was marketed as "Tough Boy". Deep pink, with green shoulders around the stem, these 6 - 7 oz. tomatoes are sweet with a delightful refined flavor. Noted for crack resistance, holding quality, and VFN resistance. I am offering it under the original name which refers to a hero in Japanese folklore.



Old Fashioned Goliath

This is a main season tomato. Its beautiful, smooth, bright-red fruits average 10 to 15 oz., with a sweet luscious flavor. Tall, plants will produce yield after yield of these perfect tomatoes. Multiple disease resistance makes these widely adaptable to any climate. Indeterminate, mid



Supersteak

Huge beefsteak tomatoes with excellent flavor., A favorite super size tomato-with most fruits weighing in at 2 lb. Burpee bred, this is the original with "beefsteak" flavor and meaty texture. Indeterminate, mid-season



Big Beef

Large beefsteak-type tomato with very firm flavorful fruits. Strong vines produce an abundance of 1-2 lb fruits. These are perfect for sandwiches and hamburgers. Very reliable. Indeterminate, mid-season



Beefmaster Hyb

Beefmaster Hybrid routinely wins the size award at county fairs and contests. This massive beefsteak-type is not only huge but very heavy-bearing, with stunning yields over a long season on indeterminate vines. Some grow as large as 1½ pounds. Good flavor. Indeterminate, mid-late



Ace 55

Ace 55 has excellent fresh tomato flavor. Large, deep red fruit with low acid content, one of the few red tomatoes to make that claim. Crack-resistant. Determinate, mid



Rutgers

All-purpose variety, ideal for canning. Ripens evenly from inside out. Bright red fruits with heavy walls average about 7 oz. Attractive, old-time favorite that has been around a long time. Full-bodied flavor and disease resistant. Indeterminate, mid

Unusual



Lime Green Salad

Small plants that produce abundant sprays of round, lime-green tomatoes that ripen further to an amber color. Great for growing in containers since plants stay small yet provide a big harvest. Fruits are 3 to 5 oz., chartreuse inside, full of juice and a luscious, tangy flavor. Determinate, mid



Chocolate Stripes - PF

Fruit is deep reddish-brown inside; the outside has beautiful greenish stripes. One of the most unique looking tomatoes, sweet with a full-rich flavor. Fruit is medium to large and are of a slightly flattened globe shape. Indeterminate, mid



Green Zebra

Fully ripened fruits are bright green, with stripes of a still lighter green. Round, smallish, fruits have excellent, tart, "real tomato" flavor. Plants are vigorous. Determinate, mid



Mint Julep

This unique little tomato is a plum-shaped version of Green Zebra and was found as a naturally occurring variant. A beautiful rose and gold striped, 2 to 4 ounce round tomato. One of the first to ripen in my garden. Fruits have a deliciously sweet, slightly tangy gourmet flavor. Lots and lots of Tomatoes. Crack-resistant. Indeterminate, mid

Dwarf (TreeType)



Dwarf Summer Sweet Gold

This mid to late season variety is one of the best flavored of all of the dwarfs. The plentiful, medium large (*six to fourteen ounces*), smooth, oblate fruit are produced on vigorous, rugose, potato leaf dwarf plants. The medium yellow tomatoes, often showing a pale pink blossom end blush, have an intense, wonderful and memorable flavor. A bit smaller in average size and a bit later maturing than 'Summertime Gold', this variety was introduced in 2015.



Dwarf Fred's Tye Dye

Rugose regular leaf foliage produce medium sized round purple tomatoes with jagged gold and green stripes and the deep crimson flesh of black tomatoes. 5-6 oz. Rich, intense, and balanced flavor. Tree Type, mid



Dwarf BrandyFred

BrandyFred is a potato leaf dwarf variety that produces oblate medium to medium large fruit that ripen to a dusky rose purple hue. The flavor is well balanced and intense, and the variety is quite prolific. Tree Type, mid



Dwarf Black Early

Regular leaf plants that are relatively compact, 4-5' tall and sprawling, medium to high yield of medium sized flattened and slightly ribbed beefsteaks of beautiful black/purple color, excellent taste and very nice texture, good balance of 'meat' and juice, 7-11 oz. The fruits have less 'green shoulders' than Cherokee Purple.. Tree Type, mid



Dwarf Big Cheef

Large smooth pink beefsteaks with very meaty flesh and small seed locules. Few seeds. 8-16 oz. Outstanding sweet flavor. Originated from a Brandywine Sudduth's cross with an unknown tomato. I grew this one and it was outstanding in productivity and flavor. Good for a large container. 3 - 4 feet tall Mid



Dwarf Mr. Snow

Plants with rugose potato leaf, 5-12 oz flattened beefsteaks with smooth shoulders, pale yellow color inside and out, very meaty flesh with small seed cavities and not many seeds. Very nice sweet flavor with a hint of citrus medium. Tree Type, mid



Dwarf 646

Medium pink beefsteak type tomatoes. Sweet and juicy with smooth shoulders. I honestly don't know much about these tomatoes, they were a gift given to a friend. I do know they are part of the Dwarf Tomato Project. This is a Russian variety from the Khilenko family. Good for a large container. Indeterminate fruiting characteristics 3 - 4 feet tall mid
